

And in the **classroom?** How many triangles can you see? Write the number here ______








Here are some more triangle puzzles like the one at the back of the book. How many triangles are there in each shape? Count them carefully!










Imagine you found these shark teeth on a beach. How long were the sharks that these teeth came from? The last 3 are tricky!




